### **2024 President's Message**

Our League recently co-sponsored a program about the Medical Aid in Dying Act and we are co-sponsoring, with AAUW, a program about the NYERA. This NY Constitutional amendment has passed twice in the NY state assembly as well as NY state senate and will now appear on the ballot, in November, for every voter in New York to decide.

These are women's and human rights issues.

Programs are a great vehicle for the LWV to be seen in the community and to provide Voter Education on issues that impact people. Of course, putting on programs requires ideas, energy, and people power. We manage to do the important work of holding candidate forums, gathering candidate information for the League's Vote411 website, and conducting voter registration at the schools. Maybe that is enough for our group for now. Programs we get involved with, going forward, will likely continue to be co-sponsorships

while we focus our energy on Voter Services.

I think we as a League are better suited to working to register students to vote and working to help with candidate forums. If we get a request to participate in a forum, as we recently did from the Bedford school district, I will send it to the membership to see if there are folks who want to participate. If not, we decline involvement.

We can also continue our involvement with the very successful Students Inside Albany program and build on our work to register the formerly incarcerated to vote.

We, LWVNEW, need to focus on what we can do and do it well. We have shown we have the ability to register, inform, and educate area voters and I look forward to your help with these efforts.

### **IMPORTANT FEBRUARY 14 DEADLINE!**

New York State has TWO primary elections this year: the April Presidential Primary and the June Primary for Congress, NYS Senate & NYS Assembly. DID YOU KNOW THAT, IN NEW YORK'S CLOSED PRIMARY SYSTEM, YOU MUST BE REGISTERED WITH A POLITICAL PARTY TO VOTE IN THAT PARTY'S PRIMARIES?

We can discuss the merits and drawbacks of a closed primary system but that is our reality. So, the next question is...

**APRIL PRIMARY DATES & DEADLINES** >Saturday, March 23 (Golden Day): Last day voter registration form must be received by the Board of Election by mail or in person. Those with a NY.Gov ID may register using the new NYS Board of Elections Online Voter Registration portal. Check your voter registration status at the NYS Voter Registration **Database Search**. Last day for an application for a mailed absentee ballot to be received by the Board of Elections. Applications may be made via email, fax, or electronically through the New York State Absentee Ballot Application Portal. See the New York State Board of Elections website or the Westchester Board of Elections website for additional

>Monday, April 1: Last day to apply in person at the Westchester Board of Elections (25 Quarropas Street, White Plains, NY 10601) for an absentee ballot. >Tuesday, April 2: Last day to postmark a completed absentee ballot (must be received by Tuesday April 9, 2024) or to submit an absentee ballot in person to the Westchester Board of Elections or any polling site throughout Westchester County by the close of the polls.

### STUDENT VOTER REGISTRATION

A new law has gone into effect statewide, requiring school districts to offer voter registration and preregistration to eligible students. Since we already offer voter registration at several area high schools, we are reaching out to them to see if the League can play a part in their compliance with the new law. We expect to continue to offer registration at the schools again this spring. Watch this space.

### SPRING SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS

Believe it or not, we've already had one of our local school districts (Bedford) reach out to set a date for their school board candidate forum! We have May 1 set aside and have reached out to LWV Westchester for a moderator.

For those of you who don't know or who need a refresher...we typically help two area school districts moderate candidate forums in the event of a contested school board race. While Katonah-Lewisboro prefers to handle their school board forums in-house, the Bedford and North Salem districts turn to us for moderators when they have a contested election.
