

## HOW TO USE VOTE411.ORG

The Vote411 website is now live. On the home page, you will see three blue boxes: *Register to Vote, Check Your Registration*, and *Find What's on Your Ballot*. It's always a good idea to confirm that you are registered to vote and you can do that by clicking *Check Your Registration*. To find the information that used to appear in the printed Voters Guide, click on *Find What's on Your Ballot*.

On the next screen, you will see GETTING STARTED and a field to enter your address. (Your address will not be saved or used for marketing purposes!) Type in your address and click on the purple *Get Started* button.

On the next screen are options to change your address or switch to Spanish. Click *Save & View Races* (green button, bottom right).

On the next screen is everything that will be on your ballot:

>The 2 statewide ballot proposals
>County Court Judge
>NYS Supreme Court Justice
>County Legislator
>Local races
>Local ballot proposals (Lewisboro & Pound Ridge)

Click on *View Race* for the first item, the first statewide ballot proposal. As you go through your ballot items, you can choose your positions and candidates by selecting them. This will allow you to print out a "cheat sheet" to bring to your polling place.

>For the Ballot Proposals, you will see the ballot language as well as a description.

>For each Race, you will see the office, length of term, salary, how many candidates you may vote for, then the candidates & any information they have entered. (Candidates have begun submitting info and will continue to do so; you may want to check back.)

Once you view an item, you can go to the next one by clicking on the right arrow. You can also click the left arrow to go back.

Once you have looked at all of the proposals and races on your ballot, hit *Finish* (green button, bottom right). You will see the option to print your "cheat sheet."
