# SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS & BUDGET VOTES

School districts will be holding their school board elections and budget votes on Tuesday, May 16.

#### **Bedford Central Schools**

BCSD has two school board trustee seats that are up for election. The district has asked us to hold Tuesday, April 25 as the date for a candidate forum should there be a contested race. (NOTE: This is a new date. It was previously April 20.) We are going on the assumption that there will indeed be a forum and are planning accordingly. The filing deadline for candidates is 5 pm on April 17, so we will know soon.

This forum would be held in person in the Fox Lane Middle School Little Theater at 7

pm. It would air live on BCSD-TV and also be available for viewing there afterwards, as well as online.

## **Katonah-Lewisboro Schools**

#### **North Salem Schools**

There are two school board seats up for election in the North Salem School District. The district clerk has set a school board candidate forum date with us in the case of a contested election. Once the candidate filing deadline has passed, we will know whether or not there is a contested election; if there is, the candidate forum would be held the evening of Tuesday, May 2. Typically, the North Salem school forums involve audience members asking questions in person, so we probably wouldn't need an ad hoc questions committee. #### **MOUNT KISCO MAYORAL PRIMARY**

There will very likely be a primary election to determine who will be the Democratic Party's candidate for Mayor of Mount Kisco.

If there is indeed a primary, we will hold a candidate forum. As soon as we have details, we will pass them along and post them on our website and social media. For now, we're operating on a working date of Wednesday, May 31 The Primary date in New York is June 27. Early voting will run from June 17 until June 25.

Voter service is our bread & butter and our candidate forums have always been a big part of that. Please consider helping out.

This would be an in-person event, as the Village of Mount Kisco has kindly offered to supply the tech and the library space free of charge, as a community service. With all of those things already taken care of, this would be the perfect opportunity to dip your toes in the waters of candidate forum planning!
