VOTER REGISTRATION

National Voter Registration Day is held annually on the fourth Tuesday of September, which means that this year it falls on September 28. We will use that date to kick off our voter registration efforts with registration sites outside of several local libraries:

>Katonah Village Library, 26 Bedford Rd.
>Mount Kisco Library, 100 Main St.
>Somers Library, Rt 139 & Reis Park
We will then hold student voter registration at area high schools the week before the
Oct 8 voter registration deadline. As of this newsletter, we've received permission to register voters at Fox Lane High School and The Harvey School.

BALLOT QUESTIONS

As a member of LWVNEW, you have received a paper copy of the League's Ballot

Proposal Voters Guide pamphlet. In the pamphlet are the five ballot proposals, as well as an explanation and the pros & cons of each. (A link to the guide is also available on the *Elections & Voting* page of our website.)

In addition to the printed guide, the New York State League held an educational program about the ballot proposals on Thursday, September 9. The program aired via Zoom and was livestreamed on Facebook.

The pamphlet and September 9 program were strictly informational, without the League taking any public positions. The New York State League has now shared its positions on four of the five proposals and held a Zoom call to announce and explain the positions. A brief summary: -Proposal 1: LWVNY is against this ballot question, feeling that is removes the guardrails for minority party participation. -Proposal 2: LWVNY supports this question, feeling it is important to enshrine the right to a healthy environment in the State Constitution.

-Proposal 3: LWVNY supports this question, feeling that New York State has to get rid of the ten-day deadline to get to the League's ultimate goal of same-day registration. -Proposal 4: LWVNY supports this question, feeling that its passage would help clear the way for a modern voting system.

(LWVNY is not taking a position on Proposal 5; it is neither for or against.)
