### **VOTER REGISTRATION**

Tuesday, September 22<sup>nd</sup> is National Voter Registration Day. LWVNEW will be holding voter registration drives at four local libraries that day, from 10 am until 2 pm.

Registration tables will be outdoors, social distancing enforced, and masks will be mandatory. Absentee ballot applications will also be available. Friday October 9th is the deadline to register in time for November's general election. Registrations must be postmarked by the 9th or dropped off in person at the Board of Elections (25 Quarropas St, White Plains) by the end of business on the 9th.

### **VOTING**

### THERE ARE 3 WAYS TO VOTE THIS YEAR

### 1. VOTE REMOTE: ABSENTEE BALLOT

All registered voters in New York now have the option of voting via absentee ballot due to the pandemic. Absentee applications (<u>applications</u>, not ballots) must be postmarked no later than **Tues.**, **Oct. 27.** 

\*From the NYS Board of Elections: "Please be warned that despite this deadline, the Post Office has advised they cannot guarantee timely delivery of ballots applied for less than 15 days before an election."

**NEW!** You can now request an absentee ballot *online* at the NYS BOE's new portal: <a href="https://absenteeballot.elections.ny.gov/">https://absenteeballot.elections.ny.gov/</a>
Once you receive your absentee ballot, fill it out carefully and return it. The postmark deadline is Election Day, **Tues Nov 3rd**. Additionally, completed absentee ballots can be dropped off at:

- > Westchester Board of Elections 25 Quarropas St, White Plains
- > Any Early Voting poll site Oct 24-Nov 1 (during operating hours)
- > Any polling place on Election Day, Nov 3

### 2. EARLY VOTING

If you wish to vote in person, New York State will offer **Early Voting** from **Saturday**, **October 24 to Sunday**, **November 1**.

Sat & Sun Oct 31 & Nov 1: Noon to 5 pm

### **Local Early Voting Polling Places:**

## 3. VOTE ON ELECTION DAY

If you prefer to vote on Election
Day, **Tuesday November 3rd**, polls will be open from 6 am to 9 pm.
Unlike Early Voting, you must vote at your designated polling place on Election Day.

Requesting or receiving an absentee ballot does not preclude you from voting in person! Mailing in an absentee ballot does not preclude you from voting in person! New York's election laws allow for a registered voter to vote in person even if she or he has received an absentee ballot. Even if that absentee ballot has been mailed in. If a person votes via absentee ballot and then votes in person, the absentee ballot will be discounted.

### ON THE BALLOT

In addition to a presidential election, voters in our five towns will have other races on their ballots: U.S. House of Representatives, State Senate and Assembly, to name a few:

>Congressional District 18

>NY State Senate District 37

>NY State Senate District 40

>NY Assembly District 93

>County District Attorney

>County Family Court Judge

# CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 17 Tuesday, October 13 at 7pm

One of our towns, Mount Kisco, is in Congressional District 17. Mondaire Jones (D) and Maureen McArdle Schulman (R) are vying for this seat in Congress, which is currently held by Nita Lowey. The White Plains and New Castle Leagues are cosponsoring this forum.

# CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 18 Wednesday, October 14 at 7pm

LWVNEW is hosting the forum for U.S. Congressional District 18, which includes 4 of our 5 towns. (Mt Kisco is in a different congressional district, CD17.) If you live in Bedford, Lewisboro, North Salem or Pound Ridge, mark your calendar. CD18 is currently represented by Sean Patrick Maloney (D); he is being challenged by Chele Farley (R) and Scott Smith (L).

## NYS SENATE DISTRICT 37 Monday, October 19 at 7pm

The town of Bedford is the only one of our five towns that lies within SD37. It is currently represented by Shelley Mayer (D); her challenger is Liviu Saimovici (R). This forum is being put on by the White Plains League and LWVNEW is co-sponsoring.

## NYS SENATE DISTRICT 40 Wednesday, October 21 at 7 pm

Lewisboro, North Salem, Mount Kisco and Pound Ridge are in SD40, which is currently represented by Peter Harckham (D). He is being challenged by Rob Astorino (R). This forum is being put on by the New Castle League and LWVNEW is co-sponsoring.

# NYS STATE ASSEMBLY DISTRICT 93 Thursday, October 8 at 7pm

All five of our towns fall within this district. Chris Burdick (D) and John Nuculovic (R) are running for this assembly seat, which is currently held by David Buchwald. This forum is being put on by the New Castle League and LWVNEW is co-sponsoring.

### **WESTCHESTER COUNTY D.A.**

### Thursday, October 1 at 7pm

Bruce Bendish (R) and Mimi Rocah (D) are running for District Attorney.
This forum is being sponsored by the Westchester County League.

### **CENSUS**

As of this newsletter, advocacy and civil rights groups had won a preliminary victory after a federal court ruled that the census count should not end prematurely. The deadline had initially been extended until

the end of October due to the pandemic but then, last month, the Trump administration reversed course and ordered that census efforts be wound down by the end of September. The administration plans to appeal the court ruling.
